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

Member Spotlight: Clint Patterson



Clint Patterson Background: I was born in Edmonton, Alberta in 1962. As a kid I had some sort of brown "box" camera that didn't require focusing. I remember waiting not so patiently for the photos to come back to me in the mail – it took weeks to see the results of my "work." I can't imagine waiting that long anymore (or paying for film and processing for my current 1000 photos per day vacations!).

After graduating from the University of Alberta I headed off to the University of Miami and ultimately found my way to Los Angeles where I worked as a psychologist and healthcare administrator for many years. Eventually I transitioned into real estate where I came to seriously appreciate the power of images as a marketing tool for properties.

When it comes to my business as a realtor, I like to be "hands on" so I usually take my own photos. It gives me a better understanding of a property when I take the interior, exterior and aerial shots. I find many real estate agents ineffectively barrage people with flowery words about a property. I'd much rather rely on images to capture a buyer's imagination and enthusiasm – it's so much more efficient and powerful!

When I'm not working with buyers and sellers in the greater LA area, I love to travel

with my spouse, Rick, and take photos of beautiful landscapes and animals. In addition, we never tire of taking pictures of our pets (three "pound puppies" at the moment). Our excitement and passion for photography stems from being able to capture an amazing setting (like Iguazu Falls, Argentina, or Snow Hill, Antarctica) and bring images home to relive the experience.

Capturing a shot of a gorgeous animal – particularly families or mother/baby combinations is another experience that gets our adrenaline rushing. Recently we traveled with Sharon Lobel, Mel Carll and Michael Collins to Southern Africa where we encountered incredible wildlife and landscapes – bringing home wonderful memories that can't be replaced but are refreshed when we look at the shots or put a slideshow on our Apple TV.

This was my third experience with Sharon as a guide, mentor and friend – she's an incredible, thoughtful travel companion and organizer. We're looking forward to future travels where we can rely on Sharon to combine her expertise as a professional photographer and travel guide with her love of visiting exotic (and even local!) locations.

I'm a little embarrassed to admit that my camera far exceeds my capabilities. I have a used Nikon D800 that I bought from Mel figuring that if it takes great shots for him, it should take great shots for me, right? It's a nice camera and I'm still getting to know it. Rick has picked out some great lenses for us and we interchange them with his new mirrorless Nikon Z6ii. My DJI Phantom IV drone is a wonderful tool for capturing 4K aerial shots. As uncool as it might be, I also have to admit that my iPhone 12 Max is a tool that I rely on when a quick opportunity pops up or I want to capture a great panorama.

My passion for photography really comes from an appreciation for what other people can do with their cameras. I've always loved Ansel Adams and Thomas Mangelson. I follow Michael Frye and love his blogs where he highlights great landscapes in California.

Marcia Gold introduced us to PPLAC and we've come to love the Digital Photo Competitions. We're always impressed at how the judges can look at a great image and offer suggestions to make it even more wonderful. The other thing that excites us about PPLAC is the enthusiasm that members have for sharing their expertise. As relative beginners, we're always learning from experts who are eager to help us advance our skills and appreciation for the power of photography.

I've never entered a competition. For me, professionally, the reward for good photography comes from helping my clients present their homes in the best possible light. And on a personal level there's always the priceless experience of bringing great images home .

I'm including a few shots that Rick and I like from my real estate portfolio and a couple of our recent trips.

The program will include tips on preparation and equipment along with technical suggestions and examples.



PPA The 12 Elements of a Merit Image

1. Impact

Compelling images evoke emotion—laughter, sadness, anger, pride.

2. Technical Excellence

The quality of the actual image as presented for viewing. Aspects such as retouching, sharpness, printing, color, and exposure should be spot on.

3. Creativity

The image is original, fresh, and an external expression of the maker's imagination.

4. Style

The subject matter meshes with the presentation. Style can also include the characteristic ways that an artist applies his or her specific lighting, posing, or compositional style to underscore the desired impact.

5. Composition

The visual elements of an image come together to express intent, whether that's to please the viewer or otherwise. The viewer's attention is captured and directed where the artist plans it to be.

6 Procontation

The way an image is showcased gives it a finished look. Everything in the presentation—mats, borders, color choices—should work to enhance the image.

7. Color Balance

Colors work together to evoke feelings in the viewer. For example, it can bring harmony to an image and enhance the emotional appeal. It can also be incongruous to arouse diverse feelings.

8. Center of Interest

This is where an image's creator wants a viewer's attention focused. There may be primary and secondary centers of interest. Sometimes all the elements in an image work together to create the center of interest.

9. Lighting

The image demonstrates excellence in the use and control of light, whether natural or additive. Light informs dimensions and shape,

sets tone and mood, and enhances the image.

10. Subject Matter

The subject matter is central to the story being told, so the subject should sync with the story.

11. Technique

The approaches used to create the image—lighting, posting, capture, presentation—work together to be effective.

12. Storytelling

The image evokes the viewer's imagination. While the act of creating is a personal thing, so too is the act of viewing. Each image is a story, and the one it tells a viewer may be unique to that person.

Future Meetings

Our September 23 speaker will be Dwight Okumoto from Honolulu discussing "Photoshop Insights and Tips".

Dwight Okumoto is a member of the Professional Photographers of Hawaii, the Professional Photographers of America, and the American Society of Photographers, among other associations. He has been a Certified Professional Photographer since 1985, holds 3 photographic Master Degrees, Master of Photography, Master Artist, Master of Electronic Imaging, and Photographic Craftsman degree, and is an Approved Photographic Instructor.
