Hello!

Happy Independence Day!! It's hard to believe we are halfway through 2021. Here is a little history to refresh your memory as we celebrate the 4th:



In 1775, people in New England began fighting the British for their independence. On July 2, 1776, the Congress secretly voted for independence from Great Britain. Two days later, on July 4, 1776, the final wording of the Declaration of Independence was approved, and the document was published. The first public reading of the Declaration of Independence was on July 8, 1776.

The first description of how Independence Day would be celebrated was in a letter from John Adams to his wife Abigail on July 3, 1776. He described "pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations" throughout the United States. However, the term "Independence Day" was not used until 1791.

Independence Day is a day of family celebrations with picnics and barbecues, showing a great deal of emphasis on the American tradition of political freedom. Activities

associated with the day include watermelon or hotdog eating competitions and sporting events, such as baseball games, three-legged races, swimming activities and tug-of-war games.

This is a month rich with history, celebrations and so many fantastic photo opportunities! If you have never photographed fireworks this is an excellent opportunity to get out there and practice shooting them. Member Spotlight: Susana Luiz



A little about me:

I am from Brazil, moved to Miami/Florida in 2003 with my family, where I got my Bachelor's in Business Administration (2014) and Master's in Non-profit Organization (2016).

In April/2017 we moved to LA for my daughter to finish her studies and work in her acting career and music, and my nephew to play soccer with wheel chair. I live in Sherman Oaks with my daughter, father, mother, sister and nephew.

Some months later, I look for a photographers' group that I could increase my knowledge and experience, and I got to the Fstop Camera Club, which is a great group. Actually, I am participating in the Board as secretary as of 2021. In the same period, I visited the PPALC and I joined this wonderful group, that has contributed a lot to improving my work and being able to help with what I can as well and also as a volunteer to bring the snacks, every once in a while, for our monthly meetings.

Here, I work as photographer doing portraits, headshots, pets, products, events, sports, shows, and others. I am a volunteer photographer for my church. Also, I sell digital and print images.

What are you passionate about shooting?

I love photography! Nature was my first passion, I wanted to paint but I wasn't good to do this and express what I wanted through painting, but when I am shooting, I feel complete and fulfilled.

It is very nice shooting the expressions of people. Also, I love shooting portraits, headshots, landscape, sunrise and sunset, pets, sports, events, and others.

What's in your bag?

In my bag I always have Canon SL3 camera (before it was a Canon 70D, but needs repair) and Sigma 17-70mm 2.8 lenses, memory cards, batteries, sometimes Canon 70-200mm 2.8, Canon 5D Mark IV camera, Canon 24-105mm 4.0 lens, Canon 50mm 1.8, flashes, lights, tripod, reflectors/bounces, etc., depending what I will be shooting.

How did you come to love photography?

My passion about shooting started when I was around 12 years old, my mom had a Kodak 35mm camera, and I learned quickly how to use this camera. Then I bought some books and started learning a little more and I did a lot of shooting, from small parties to several trips with my family.

In Florida, I had a small camera Canon Power Shot SX230 HS, that I used to photograph vacations, parties, meetings of my family/friends, music school showcases, a friends' wedding, concerts, pageants, gym competitions, acting school showcases, also soccer both regular soccer and soccer with wheel chair, and photoshoot for friends and family. I did photography as a hobby and for fun, and I wanted to do better images, then I started to do several researches about photography and online courses, workshops, webinars, and a lot photo.

In 2014, I did two courses of photography in the community school with a professional in person. Then, in November/2014, I bought my first digital camera, a Canon 70D with 18-

35mm 5.6 and 70-250mm 5.6 lens, and some months later I started to learn photo edition with Photoshop Elements 12 and LR5. I was fascinated with what I could do.

Also, in 2014 I joined a group of photographers (PWCC) in my city, Pembroke Pines/Florida, and 2015 I joined another group. It was wonderful for me, I learned a lot things with them, and I participated in several competitions, trips, courses, workshops, and conferences.

And in this same year, I started to work as photographer doing portraits, headshots, several types of events, concerts, showcases, wedding, quincenera, parties, sports, red carpets, fashion shows and photoshoot for clients, friends and family.

I worked with music and art academies doing photography and videos of their shows and concerts. Also, I worked for some non-profit organizations as a volunteer.

Accolades you've earned along the way (optional but nice to share)

I don't have much in awards. I had some images with excellent critiques through all of the years.

In Florida, I participated in print and digital photo competitions, I was very happy because I had some images among the best, and in PWCC 2018 one of my images won in first place ("The Lady").

In 2019, one of my images was among the ten best of Fstop Camera Club. And in June/21, Shoot and Share group of PPLAC, I had one of my images in second place, it is very nice and I was glad to see my image classified among the best of the night.

With advices and critiques of my friends and judges it allows me to see my images in a different perspective and understand how to apply the several techniques to get a better image and be better. I got a lot of knowledge and experience through these years, but it's not much in comparison of what I still have to learn.

The world of photography is fascinating. And I am learning everyday!

PPA The 12 Elements of a Merit Image

1. Impact

Compelling images evoke emotion—laughter, sadness, anger, pride.

2. Technical Excellence

The quality of the actual image as presented for viewing. Aspects such as retouching, sharpness, printing, color, and exposure should be spot on.

3. Creativity

The image is original, fresh, and an external expression of the maker's imagination.

4. Style

The subject matter meshes with the

August 2020 Best of Show "Dahlia Monster" Mel Carll presentation. Style can also include the characteristic ways that an artist applies his or her specific lighting, posing, or compositional style to underscore the desired impact.

5. Composition

The visual elements of an image come together to express intent, whether that's to please the viewer or otherwise. The viewer's attention is captured and directed where the artist plans it to be.

6. Presentation

The way an image is showcased gives it a finished look. Everything in the presentation —mats, borders, color choices—should work to enhance the image.

7. Color Balance

Colors work together to evoke feelings in the viewer. For example, it can bring harmony to an image and enhance the emotional appeal. It can also be incongruous to arouse diverse feelings.

8. Center of Interest

This is where an image's creator wants a viewer's attention focused. There may be primary and secondary centers of interest. Sometimes all the elements in an image work together to create the center of interest.

9. Lighting

The image demonstrates excellence in the use and control of light, whether natural or additive. Light informs dimensions and shape, sets tone and mood, and enhances the image.

10. Subject Matter

The subject matter is central to the story being told, so the subject should sync with the story.

11. Technique

The approaches used to create the image lighting, posting, capture, presentation—work together to be effective.

12. Storytelling

The image evokes the viewer's imagination. While the act of creating is a personal thing, so too is the act of viewing. Each image is a story, and the one it tells a viewer may be unique to that person.

Dwight Okumoto is a member of the Professional Photographers of Hawaii, the Professional Photographers of America, and the American Society of Photographers, among other associations. He has been a Certified Professional Photographer since 1985, holds 3 photographic Master Degrees, Master of Photography, Master Artist, Master of Electronic Imaging, and Photographic Craftsman degree, and is an Approved Photographic Instructor.


